OATH OF IDENTITY.

On this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of September in the year  
one thousand eight hundred and sixty six personally appeared

who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the  
identical Horace Smith who was  
a Sergeant in the company commanded by  
Captain A. W. Benson in the regiment  
154th N.Y. commanded by St. Col. R. C. Barnes  
that he enlisted on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of July 1862  
for the term of Three Years and was discharged  
at Atlanta Georgia on the 31<sup>st</sup> day  
of October 1864 by reason of Promotion  
from 1st to 2nd Lieut.
