

PVT. EMORY SWEETLAND, Co. B, 154th REGT., N.Y.S. VOL. INF. GIVEN TO CAPT. JOHN C. GRISWOLD, Co. F, 154th. REGT., N.Y.S. VOL. INF.

EMORY SWEETLAND was born on October 14, 1835. He was living on a farm on the Bucktooth Road in Little Valley when the war began. He enlisted on August 11, 1862, at Little Valley, to serve three years; mustered in as private, Co. B, September 24, 1862; mustered out with company, June 11, 1865, near Bladensburg, Md.

JOHN C. GRISWOLD was born in Oneida County, N. Y., August 1, 1819. His father died in 1821 and ten years later his mother moved to Arkwright with her eleven children. At age 18, Griswold was a captain in the local militia. He enrolled at age 43, on September 3,

1862, at Jamestown, to serve three years; mustered in as first lieutenant, Co. F, September 23, 1862; as captain, April 14, 1863; wounded in the right arm near the shoulder and captured in action, May 2, 1863, at Chancellorsville, Va., was in Libby prison until May 26, 1863, when he moved to St. John's College Hospital, Annapolis, Md; rejoined regiment, August 5, 1863, at Alexandria, Va.; discharged for disability from wounds, April 28, 1864, at Chattanooga, Tenn. For forty years, Griswold was justice of the peace in Arkwright and he represented the town for six terms on the Chautauqua County Board of Supervisors. He died July 24, 1892.
