I see that the regimental officers made no report of Battle of Gettysburg
Lieut Col D B Allen of Otto N.Y. was in command at the time. The regimental monument at Gettysburg says the regiment lost 1 killed and 11 wounded, now 14 known names are in the National cemetery at that place

I know am among the unknown
as the rebels held the ground where we fought
the first day & they stripped the dead so we
could not tell just how many they were
In talking it over with Dr Van Dorman our
Surgeon since the war we estimate the
Regiment lost about 25-killed at Gettysburg

I was acting Hospital Steward of the Regiment
at Gettysburg
