Philinda Swetland,⁷ a daughter of Eleazer⁶ and Philinda Crane Swetland, was born in July, 1832. She was married to Alden Bates of Middlefield, N. Y. She died June 16, 1853. They had no children.

George Swetland,⁷ a son of Eleazer⁶ and Philinda Crane Swetland, was born in Middlefield, Otsego County, N. Y., September 26, 1836. He married Jane M.⁷ Swetland, a daughter of Palta⁶ and Mariah N.⁷ Swetland. He served three years in the "War of the Rebellion," enlisting at Portland, N. Y., in 1862, in Company E, 154th Reg. N. Y. V., and served three years. He was constantly on duty excepting only about three weeks when he was in a hospital at Philadelphia on account of a wound in the left chest received at the Battle of Gettysburg, after which he rejoined his company and regiment, was sent to East Tennessee and attached to Sherman's Army and marched to the sea; was orderly sergeant and most of the time in command of the company. Despite his refusal he was commissioned lieutenant by the Governor of his state. His comrades say that his cheerful and buoyant disposition kept them in good spirits and they were ever "ready to go in" to any battle with George. He resides on his farm in the town of Harmony, Chautauqua County, N. Y. Their children were:

Eleazer Swetland, Jr.,⁷ son of Eleazer⁶ and Philinda Crane Swetland, was born at Middlefield, Otsego County, N. Y. He married Sarah Brown at Portland, N. Y., in 1861, and in 1862 he enlisted in the 112th Reg. N. Y. V., but got transferred to Company E, 154th Reg., to be with his brother George. He died in camp with fever at Chickamauga, Tenn., March 21, 1864, and his body rests in the National Cemetery. They had one daughter—

Minnie⁸ born 1862, at Portland, N. Y.

Martha Swetland,⁷ daughter of Eleazer⁶ and Philinda Crane Swetland, was born in Middlefield, Otsego County, N. Y. She married Willard Whitney, and lived for several years at Hopbottom, Susquehanna County, Penn.; removed to Portland, N. Y., thence to Arkansas City, Kan. She died January 15, 1890. Their children were:
