distressing illness, David Thompson
Taylor, an only brother of Mrs. R. Tut-
tle and Dr. H. C. Taylor of this place and

from that time to his death he was al-
most entirely helpless. Through this
whole period he manifested a cheerful-
ness of spirit and a resignation truly
wonderful. For many years he was an
exemplary member of the M. E. church
and adorned well his profession, and in
all the relations of life he maintained
the most perfect status of moral recti-
tude. He enjoyed the warmest affec-
tions of his family and friends and of
his church, and the esteem of his
acquaintances and the community gener-
ally, and has left a rich example of the
power of christian truth and faith, and
it cannot be doubted has entered into
that rest prepared for the people of
God. More in regard to any man it is
needless to say. He has left a wife and
one daughter who specially mourn his
loss. His funeral was attended at the
house on North Div. St., by his pastor,
the Rev. Mr. Nickle and he was buried
in Evergreen Cemetery, Thursday the
25th.
