**MILITIA EXEMPTIONS.**—The question of allowing exemptions from taxation by reason of service in the State militia, is exciting considerable interest in various quarters. Assessors in some places make the allowance, and in other places they do not. Among those who have declined are the Assessors of Syracuse, and the matter is to be adjourned to the courts. On Thursday last Justice Parker of the Supreme Court of the Sixth District, granted an alternative mandamus commanding the Syracuse Assessors to allow military tax exemptions as provided by the law of 1802, or to show cause at a Special Term of the Supreme Court, to be held at the former on the 22d inst., why they were so adjourned.
