Matthew Woodworth was born at Conwango, Cattaraugus county, N. Y., December 3, 1841 and died December 21, 1914 at Clinton, Iowa. He enlisted in the Civil War from 154 N. Y. at the age of 25 years serving three years. On November 10, 1866 he was united in marriage to Fanny Biggs, to this union was born 6 children four of whom survive. November 9, 1894, he was again married to Frances B. Ward who preceded him in death three years ago. Beside the four children are four grandchildren, one brother William and one sister, Mrs. George Squires of Holton who mourn the loss of a loving father and brother. Funeral services were held at the church at ten o'clock Christmas morning, conducted by his pastor Rev. MacFarlane. The G. A. R. gave their burial services at the church paying their last tribute to a comrade faithful and true. He was laid to rest in the Holton cemetery. The pallbearers were six old soldiers and were Mr. Richards, John Shrontz, A. J. Way, T. H. Cope, J. B. Gardner, and O. H. Grubbs.
