Camp John Manly Va March 30th 1863

Dear Mother

i am seated to answer youre letter that i recieved last night and was happy to here from you that you was well as you are i am glad you are so strict about writing i like to here from you often rite every week for it is great pleasure to here from home tell Cal that it was little i thought about seeing him again when he left us at haymarket we have had a great deal harder march than that when we marched to fredricksburgh through the mud 6 days and lay on the ground nights but we lived well while the sesesh catle lasted Harrison and John Campbell has got back to the company if rosa wants to come and live with you this summer i am willing you need not send mee any shirts but i wish you would send a stamp or two when you rite for i cant get any here tell bil that i would rather see him in the grave than to see him down here Cal can tell him something about it
