ANDREW G. PARK.

Andrew G. Park, a prosperous farmer, of Wesley, died at his home in that place Wednesday afternoon, March 17. Mr. Park has been ill several months. He was born in Dayton, Aug. 6, 1839. He was supervisor of his town for four years, and was one of the best known residents of the town of Dayton. During the Civil War he enlisted with Company B, New York Volunteers. He was with Sherman on his march to the sea and was in some of the greatest battles of the war. At one time he was captured and held at Salisbury prison. After the war Mr. Park engaged in farming on a scientific basis on a large scale. He was prominent in business and social affairs. He leaves besides his widow, three sons and one daughter. The funeral was held Sunday at 2 o'clock. Burial in the Park Lawn cemetery at Wesley under the auspices of Phoenix Lodge, No. 262, F. & A.M. of Gowanda.
