And I do strictly charge and require all Non Commissioned Officers, and Soldiers under his command to be obedient to his orders as Commissionary Sergeant. And he is to observe and follow such orders, and directions from time to time, as shall receive from me, or the future Commanding Officer of the Regiment, or other Superior Officers and Non Commissioned Officers in him, according to the rules and discipline of War. This Warrant to continue in force during the pleasure of the Commanding Officer of the Regiment for the time being.
