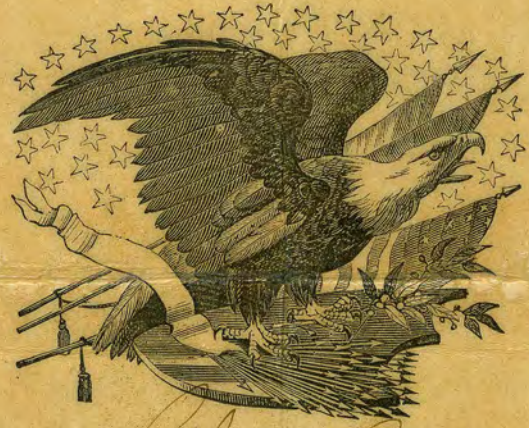


Severe gun shot wound of left thigh, splintering of

VOLUNTEERS who was enrolled on the *23^d* day of *August*
 one thousand eight hundred and *62* to serve *two* years or
 during the war, is hereby **Discharged** from the service of the United States,
 this *Eleventh* day of *June*, 1865, at *near Braamstering*

by reason of *Incompliance with his order No 77 War Dep*
 (~~No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.~~)

Said *Charles E Whitney* was born in *Sardinia*
 in the State of *New York*, is *21* years of age,
5 feet *8* inches high, *Light* complexion, *Blue* eyes,
Light hair, and by occupation, when enrolled, a *Farmer*

Given at *near Braamstering* this *Eleventh* day of
June 1865.

* This sentence will be erased should there be anything
 in the conduct or physical condition of the soldier
 rendering him unfit for the Army

OATH OF IDENTITY.

Charles E. Whitney
of the town of Little Valley
County of Cattaraugus in the State of New York

On this 30th day of November in the year
one thousand eight hundred and sixty five personally appeared

before me, the undersigned, a Justice of the Peace for the county
and State above mentioned, Charles E. Whitney

who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the
identical Charles E. Whitney who was

a Private in the company commanded by
Captain William Schock in the regiment

15th N.Y. commanded by St. Col. S. S. Warner

that he enlisted on the twenty third of August 1862
for the term of three years and was discharged

at Fort Hadensburg Md. on the 11th day
of June 1865 by reason of Gen Order

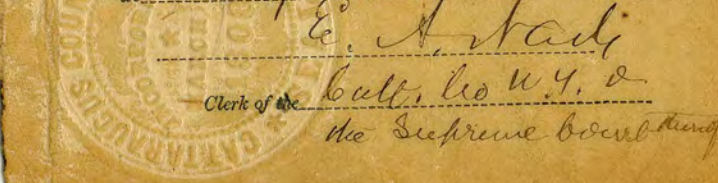
