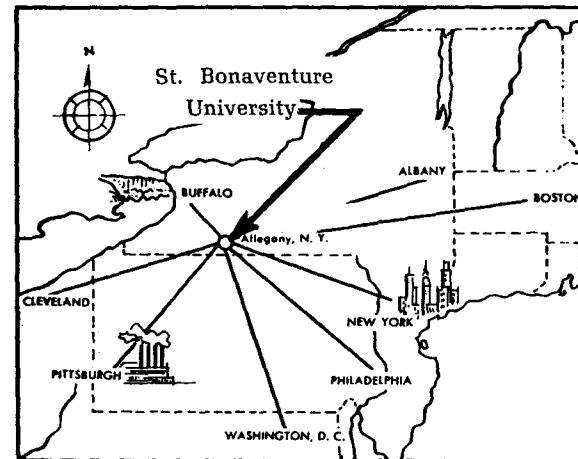


St. Bonaventure and Its Campus



St. Bonaventure University, founded in 1857, is a coeducational institution conducted by the Franciscan Fathers, Province of the Most Holy Name of the Order of Friars Minor, and fully accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

The University's 550-acre campus is situated in the scenic foothills of the Allegheny Mountains in Southwestern New York between Allegany and Olean, about 75 miles southeast of Buffalo. The University may be easily reached by New York State Highway 17, by the main line of the Erie-Lackawanna railroad and the Buffalo-Washington line of the Penn Central railroad, and by air to Olean (Mohawk), Bradford, Pa. (Allegheny) or Buffalo (American, United and others).
