

Fr. Francis Storms

Fr. Francis earned his master's in theology from St. Bonaventure in 1973 and was ordained Dec. 6, 1975, at St. Francis Church in New York City. He joined SBU's theology faculty in 1975, and was also named assistant director of the graduate theology program. He was appointed assistant registrar in 1977, and named registrar in 1978. He also spent four years as guardian of the St. Bonaventure Friary (1979-83), served as executive vice president under Fr. Mathias Doyle, OFM, from 1983-87, and represented the university as president in 1985 when Fr. Mathias took a sabbatical.


What impressed Fr. Larry most about Fr. Francis was his ability to connect with people from all walks of life.

"He was the quintessential Franciscan – available to all and respectful of everyone," he said. "He always dealt with people at their level, not his, whether it was a baron of industry or a waitress in an Olean restaurant ... a university trustee or an hourly employee."



A Trip to the Windy City



ST. BONAVENTURE, N.Y., June 2, 2006 — The St. Bonaventure University SIFE team finished first at the 2006 SIFE USA National Exposition in the Discover Financial Success Skills Individual Topic Competition May 21-23 in Kansas City, MO.

SIFE (Students in Free Enterprise) is an international non-profit organization active on more than 1,000 college and university campuses in more than 40 countries. SIFE students form teams that serve their communities by developing projects that take what they are learning in their classrooms about business and use it to solve real world problems for real people.

“This is the farthest we’ve ever gone before and the best we’ve ever done,” said Todd Palmer, a St. Bonaventure associate professor of business and the SIFE adviser. Palmer started the St. Bonaventure SIFE chapter four years ago when he first began teaching at St. Bonaventure. The program has grown from six members in its first year to about 60 today.

St. Bonaventure University offers opportunities at 38 colleges and universities in 27 foreign countries; in different languages (including English) and different fields of study. You do not need a foreign language background to study abroad. Most programs require little or no language experience.

Summer in Oxford

The Warming House is open 2:30- 6 p.m., with meals served at 4:45 p.m. Sunday through Friday.







The Clare College core curriculum is truly an honor's program for every student at St. Bonaventure University.


Founded in 1939 by Fr. Thomas Plassmann, O.F.M., President of St. Bonaventure College, and led by its first Director, Fr. Philotheus Boehner, O.F.M., the Franciscan Institute stands as the pre-eminent center in North America of teaching, research and publication on the history, spirituality and intellectual life of the Franciscan movement.

Thanks in large measure to its magnificent library of medieval and modern sources, the Institute first gained international prominence through its research on the great intellectual figures of the Franciscan tradition, resulting in the publication of the critical editions of their works which was heralded the world over as demonstrating the very highest standards of scholarly research and publication.

In response to the call of the Second Vatican Council (1963) for religious communities to return to the original sources of their charism, the Institute quickly developed several graduate programs of study that now grant degrees through the School of Franciscan Studies, the teaching component of the Franciscan Institute. We offer not only an M.A. degree in Franciscan Studies and the Advanced Certificate but also other, less formal opportunities for study and research through a rich complement of Continuing Education programs.

We are proud to be the flagship Franciscan university. We invite you to share our tradition.



Mermaids at St. Bonaventure

Most universities are thought of in terms of the people on their campuses or the classes and activities they offer. SBU is certainly home to all of these things, but it is also home to a variety of stories generated by people on campus and its history. Ghosts or spirits that are believed to be lurking about the buildings are a common topic, and other campus mysteries raise questions year after year.

Top: A "Feejee Mermaid" was found in a locked Francis Hall storage space by Bro. David Haack, OFM, in 1996 as reported in *The Bona Venture*. While she resides in the first floor atrium of the Quick Center now, the mermaid is reported to have ended up at Saint Bonaventure in the 1950's, coming as a donation from the estate of architect Stanford White.

Middle: A variety of rumors exist around fifth Dev. The best rumors are those that have been derived from the story of the Black Mass. In the early 1960's a group of students stole some unconsecrated hosts from the Dev chapel and collected a few books in an attempt to perform a Black Mass. Although the exact events of what occurred on fifth Dev are unclear, the students did proceed upstairs to a former recreation room and attempted to conjure up some type of spirit. The supposed Black Mass was interrupted by a friar or residence life staff member that walked upstairs and so it was never carried through. The students suffered severe consequences by the University including an expulsion. Students today believe that ghosts linger up on the fifth floor and that this Black Mass could have brought some of them there. They also believe that this is the reason that the fifth floor is presently closed and proceeding up there is prohibited.

Bottom: De La Roche Hall is currently the site of science and computer classes here on campus. In addition, it is one of the oldest buildings on campus. It is also home to one of the infamous ghost stories here on campus. It is told that at one point a fire took place on the third floor of the building killing a student typing a paper late at night. The story holds that often times a light is seen shining bright from the windows late at night on the third floor. Some hold that the ghost of the student is still trying to finish his paper. Others hold that he had finished the paper but he now returns searching for the remains of it. In either case, there is a diligent student that still lurks on the third floor.





"MERTON'S HEART" is an open hillside space which is visible from the St. Bonaventure campus. Merton was known for his walks through the hills of the surrounding area and this site took its name from its association with those walks.



The hillside was originally cleared in the 1920's for oil drilling, but had been abandoned for that purpose by the time Merton arrived at St. Bonaventure. There's no evidence that the site was one especially favored by Merton, who would often cross the railroad bridge over the Allegheny River to walk up to Martini Rocks and a hilltop cottage owned by his friend Robert Lax's brother-in-law. Nonetheless, the site remains a visible reminder of Merton's presence on campus and a continuing place of contemplation and prayer for the St. Bonaventure community.
