September, 1953 . . .

We came from many places and many things. Some came from the factory bench or the separation center, while others arrived from a lazy summer after commencement's flattery. And so, with high hopes, varsity sweaters, white bucks, etc., we arrived to find our place in the sun—or rain, or fog, or snow—of St. Bonaventure's 500 acres of learning.

Most of us met roommates, but all of us met sophomores and senators. They told us about Rules and Hazing and many of us began to fear the worst. Then in early October, our Reign of Terror was realized.

Education is, in many respects, only another word for discovery. And we found that our education was not limited to De La Roche and Friedsam Memorial. Yes, for the most part, our courses were interesting and informative; but, so too was our life outside the classroom.

This extra-curricular activity was well supported by the class of 1957. All of this helped to produce the birth of the Off-Campus Club for day students, the resurrection of the university radio station, WOFM, and a revised format of *The Laurel* magazine.

Rules dragged on and so did we. But we looked forward to a brief respite in the form of a Sports Dance scheduled for November 6th. We were promised girls galore from D'Youville, Rosary Hill Colleges, but a sixteen inch snowfall produced a painful scarcity of women.

Dinks and ties were shelved as memories and we were soon on our way home for a much-longed-for Thanksgiving vacation. On our return we learned of the death of our Dean of Studies, Rev. Vincent Divine, O.F.M., who was succeeded by the Rev. Brian Duffy.

After Christmas vacation, basketball and last minute craming occupied most of our free time. This was coach Eddie Donavan's first year at Bonaventure and he guided a memorable team. A member of this team was Mal Duffy who broke three existing records culminating in his 36 point score over Ithaca College. And towards the end of the season a bus excursion to N.Y.C. sponsored by the National Federation of Catholic College Students ended in watching St. Bonaventure defeat Seton Hall in a close game. The score — 63 - 60.

The close of our Freshman year was marked by a procession as students gathered in Forness Stadium to salute the Blessed Mother in her Marion year.

Our sophomore year was begun under the leadership of John Durr who had been re-elected President. Henry Herfel was Vice President, with Vin Zullo, Secretary and Sam Boles, Treasurer. Jim Luke, John Leary and Pete Zambito were elected to the senate.

Early in October WOFM inaugurated the first annual Fall Festival. Now that we were

On the more serious side, Bonaventure played host to nine debating teams. The recognition of Red China proved a thorny topic for that discussion.

Our sophomore year saw the fruition of an important project on campus. With the completion of two new residence halls, the temporary barracks were hauled down. To supply the much-needed curtains for Falconio and Robinson Halls, the President of the University, The Rev. Juvenal Lalor, O.F.M., appealed to the students for help. Various committees were formed culminating in the Inter-Fraternity Council's Drape Drag in Olean.

Coach Eddie Donovan's Brown Indians once again captured our interest during the long winter months. This was the year when Mal Duffy entered the realm of the choosen few by scoring over 1,000 points in his collegiate career.

In May, the Journalism Department once again sponsored High School Press Day. More than a thousand secondary school students and guests heard James Hagerty, the Presidential news secretary, as the official speaker.

Late in the year we held elections. Stan Pylipow was choosen to head the class during junior year, with Bob Zugger as vice president. Carol Stark took over the post as secretary and Vince LaPorta was treasurer. Ron Mega, Pete Zambito and Jim Luke were elected to the senate.

Headlines in *The Bona Venture* announced that Jim Moran and Jack Carlin were choosen Prom Chairmen for 1956. This was only the beginning of the many headaches they faced to bring us the most successful weekend in Bonaventure's history.

The fall of our junior year was begun under a new administration. The Rev. Brian Lhota, O.F.M., was installed as our 13th president, with the Rev. Cornelius Welch, O.F.M., as Dean of the University and Rev. Simeon Capizzi, O.F.M., as Dean of Discipline.

In late October, St. Bonaventure played host to a N.F.C.C.S. convention. The weekend proved to be a smashing success for as it turned out, most of the delegates were girls.

A nice surprise greeted everyone on campus the morning we picked up the paper in the Small Cafe to find that St. Bonaventure had received a substantial grant from the Ford foundation. A second surprise occured when word was received that the tuition was boosted from \$14. to \$17. a credit hour effective for the following year.

When pictures of pretty girls flooded the pages of *The Bona Venture* we knew that once again it was Prom time. Our theme was "Southern Melody," our band was Charlie Spivak's. The "Man who plays the sweetest trumpet in the world" officiated at the crowning of Queen Julie Murphy of New Jersey who was escorted by Tony Coppola.

Senior year, and for most of us this meant the termination of our formal education. The class elected Tom Minnock as our final president and Vince Zullo as vice president. Carol Stark and Vince La Porta retained their posts as secretary and treasurer. Pete Zambito gained the presidency of the Student Senate with Ron Mega, Jack Leary and Steve Bush assisting as the other senior members.

Soon after we were back on campus the senior class held a highly successful picnic. This

was closely followed by the Fall Festival, which was also sponsored by the seniors.

We saw many changes taking place during our last year at Bonaventure. After much controversy, hazing was formally abolished; but rules remained. We also saw senior privileges extended for the entire year, the leveling of "diaper row," a new hi-fi system installed in

the dining hall, and cinemascope movies in the gym.

While election fever was sweeping the country, the B.V. conducted a poll querying faculty and students on their White House choice for the next four years. The school went as did the

nation — Ike and Dick over Adlai and Estes.

November was also noted for its Military Ball. Under the leadership of chairmen Pat
Pelligrini and Bob Zugger the Bartlett Country Club provided a perfect setting for a wonderful

Enthusiasm burned as a hot coal bursting into flames as Capt. Brenden McCann guided the ball team through many games. Exultation swept the "Aud" as Canisius bowed to the Bonnies; pandamonium broke loose in the "chow" hall when we accepted our bid to the N.I.T. The team had done a great job and we were proud of them.

As our final year rapidly came to an end we began to realize that we would soon have to apply those principles learned in and out of the classroom to our way of life. And we began to see that our major field of study was important, not only intrinsically, but also as a path of discovery for our future life. This then was our education.

Another often overlooked feature of his directorship has been the passing of the minor sports of baseball and cross country and the intramural sports from the twilight into their full place on the local sports scene.




Basketball Coach Eddie Donovan

In his first season it was a very green and inexperienced team that took to the hardwoods under a new coach. Still when the last "Swish" was heard in March, some four months later, the record stood at 12-11, posted against some of the toughest competition in the nation. The following year it was 13-11 and in our junior year we moved up a little further with a 14-12 mark for the season.

But this was all building up to the today's climax of this rebuilding that had been quietly taking place for a number of years . . . 15 - 5 for the regular season, including two consecutive overtime losses when Capt. Brendan McCann was hospitalized.

Stressing team play, fundamental basketball and a great defense, the Indians won a bid to the National Invitational Tournament.







Brendan McCann climaxed a brilliant college career this season as captain and playmaker for the Brown Indians. The 6'2" senior from Brooklyn, earned All-American Honorable Mention from the Associated Press but most basketball fans from Upstate New York rate him far higher than that.

Frequently he drew the dubious honor of guarding the opponent's top scorer. His deft blind passing and his three quarter court passes that were frequently the fuel for Bona's driving style, quickly won him the respect of every opposing ball club.

After ranking as the top scorer for the Bonnies in his junior year with an output of 376 points, he assumed the role of decoy and playmaker this season with the same competence that he earlier demonstrated as a scoring threat. This year he hit for 213 points in 18 games, while setting up team mates for more than an equal number of points.








Gerry Olshefski, a 6'5" senior from Hanover, Pennsylvania, was one of the two tallest men on this year's squad. Aggressiveness and hustle were his big characteristics as he scored 95 points and snagged 90 rebounds in 16 games.

His best performances this year were in the Little Three games, especially against Niagara when he turned in two great defensive performances in holding down the high scoring Boo Ellis of the Purple Eagles.

His size, coupled with his 190 pounds, gave the Bonnies some real power beneath the backboards for rebounds and Gerry was never adverse to using it to his advantage.


His best shot is a one-handed jump from just outside the foul line. From inside he is very accurate with a right hand hook shot. For three seasons of varsity ball his records are 276 points and 253 rebounds.






A physics major, Larry sets a high standard academically. He has earned a spot on the Dean's Honor List every semester since entering college.






A standout hoopster in high school, the scoring records he set while in New Jersey are still standing.





Besides his prowess on the court, Connors is also the top lefty hurler on the baseball squad and rates as a steady above average student in an Arts course.






One of the chief holler guys of the Indians, Don is another ball hawker on the club who turns frequent steals and pass interceptions into quick baskets on fast breaks.







A six footer, relatively short for basketball company, he also was an outstanding trackman for Hornell High and his speed aided the Brown Indians' whip-like fast break this season.





The other of two sophomore starters on Donovan's quintet this year, Ken has demonstrated a deadly jump shot and has developed into a top flight defensive ball player.

He finished the season as the second highest scorer on the varsity with a total output of 268 points in 20 games for an average of 13.4 points per game.

An outstanding rebounder for his size, Fair-field depends upon coil-like legs to keep him up with the opponent's big men. He was a four sport letter winner in high school and still holds the New York State Section VI pole vault record which he set as a senior at Hinsdale.



Last but certainly not the least is the latest addition to the varsity quintet, Mike Cavalier, who joined the team when he became eligible for competition in January. At 6'4" he added considerable rebounding and bench strength to the Indians.

A product of Manual High in Brooklyn, as is Brendan McCann, Mike was a star in the Armed Forces basketball competition with the Air Force. He was stationed in Japan and Korea and picked up a great deal of his basketball savy on the far side of the globe.

He appeared in six games during the regular season for the Bonnies and tallied a total of 42 points for an even seven points per game average.





The top scoring performance of the season for the frosh came when Sam Stith hit for 44 points in the victory over Jamestown Arts and Metals at Jamestown.



Sam Stith ranked as the leading scorer for the frosh rolling up an average of 23 points per game over the thirteen game schedule.



Planning the Centennial



Next October 4th will see the beginning of the most impressive ceremonies in the century-old history of St. Bonaventure. That day, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, will mark the opening of the celebration of the centennial of the University.

A vigorous building program and a science symposium are among the leading features of centennial observance which is now in the planning stage as this volume goes to press. The three living presidents of the university, Rev. Thomas Plasmann, O.F.M., Rev. Juvenal Lalor, O.F.M., and Rev. Brian Lhota, O.F.M., whose three administrative reigns span four decades without interruption, will play an important role in the year-long celebration.

St. Bonaventure has progressed a great way since Rev. Pamphilus, O.F.M., became the first president of the college in 1858, then a one-building structure devoted to the teaching of arts. The initial endowment of the school consisted of 200 acres and \$5,000.

Today, St. Bonaventure boasts of a total land area of 500 acres, a nearly twenty-fold increase over the original faculty members to almost one hundred and educational facilities assessed at about seven million dollars.

All of this great advancement has been insipired by the Franciscan philosophy "In sanctitae et doctrina."




