Today's student is complex, he demands more than an academic education, sometimes wanting to be alone with himself, at other times needing the involvement offered by academic pursuit, extracurricular activity, socialization, sports.


Perhaps the role of the student can be best expressed in the concept of awareness—awareness on the academic, political, cultural, and social level. St. Bonaventure has witnessed the formation of a Free Student Union, Students for a Democratic Society, a Head Start program, a CCD teaching staff, a lecture and a film series, providing the student with an opportunity to channel his particular interests into creative thought and work. There is an inherent drive in many of today's students to expose themselves to as many facets of life as possible in an attempt to become more concerned, more understanding, more aware individuals. The college student does not seek approval as much as he seeks understanding, understanding which will enable him to develop in a manner most meaningful to him, as a unique and free human being.

St. Bonaventure, seeking its own identity or role as a Catholic university, does not offer the student a neat and concise packaged outlook on life. Each student, by his limited involvement with the world through his perceptions, his activity, his campus affiliations, must ultimately formulate his value judgments. The emphasis is on the individual student. In his inaugural address, Fr. Reginald Redlon, O.F.M., University President, expressed this idea by asserting that "We dare not take him (the student) for granted. He must be treated as sacred."

Our four years of undergraduate study cannot be labeled as a period of apathy, a period of involvement, an era of change, an era of complete fulfillment. At best, it can be referred to as a period of the student searching and questioning. Like the world around it, St. Bonaventure is marked by a series of failures and successes, comprised of a student body which perhaps expected too much from a new administration too soon. For some, the failure of expectation turned to bitterness, for others, a slow and gradual step toward improvement. Nevertheless, St. Bonaventure has succeeded in giving us a warm and intimate glimpse into human relationships, providing the individual with some type of socialization and development. It is to this spirit, accenting the individual student, his views, his moral code, his philosophy on life, that the 1969 BONADIEU addresses and presents itself.





































With an extended Spring practice session, and two Spring games, the 1968 Bonnies tackled one of the toughest club football schedules in the nation.

The seven-game schedule included such top ranked teams as Detroit, Siena, and Adelphi.

Sparked by a fine coaching crew, led by Head Coach Matt Conte and assistants, Don Raabe, Joe Pastore, Motor Anastasia, John Banks, and Dick Conrad, the Brown and White showed desire and poise in the initial season.


After winning the season opener, 21-16, over Scranton, St. Bonaventure suffered successive defeats at the hands of Niagara and Canisius.


The fast improving Bonnies held a highly touted Adelphi team to a 0-0 halftime score, only to lose in the final stanzas.

Facing fourth-ranked Detroit the following week, the team held a 14-6 lead in the final quarter, but could not prevent a rugged Detroit team from pulling into a 14-14 deadlock.

The final game of the season found an inspired Bona football team, led by quarterback Tim Bergen, battering RIT 36-14, assuring their supporters that they were already anticipating a successful season in 1969.







The home meet lineup was equally challenging, with the Brown and White facing Youngstown State, Notre Dame, and the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy.


Led by Co-Captains Bill Brennan and Bill Reichle, St. Bonaventure found its strength in seniors Dave McClave, Mike Macys, Tom Stein, and Tom Dougherty; juniors Mike Piedmont, John Goodman, and Ed Flanagan, and sophomores Rick Martin and Frank Fernandez.

Despite the crucial lack of depth, St. Bonaventure scored impressive wins over Ithaca College, Hobart, Brockport State, and Cortland State, on the way to their winning record, with an equally impressive performance in the N.Y.S. Championships at Syracuse.

The '68-69 season brought new additions to the Bona swimming record book. Sophomore Rick Martin set a varsity record in the 200-yd. butterfly with a time of 2:15.0. 

BASKETBALL



The 1968-69 season was one of learning and building for the Bonnies. An NCAA tournament ban and probation gave St. Bonaventure an unofficial loss before the actual game schedule began. With hopes of post-season tournament play already lost, the Brown Indians, had to work for just a fine game record—nothing else.

The 24-game schedule began with three quick wins over regular losers, Detroit College, St. Francis of Loretto, and Thomas More. All-American Bob Lanier led the way for the Bonnies. That was no surprise. The question was how much support would the rest of the team, particularly sophomore hopefuls Ed Klimkowski, Greg Gary, Dale Tepas, and Paul Grys, be able to lend Lanier, Captain Jim Satalin, Bill Kalbaugh, and ailing John Hayes.

The first three wins had been more or less expected. But the next two could very well tell the story for things to come through the rest of the season. In just three short years a fiery rivalry had developed with Toledo, and this year the Rockets were as threatening as ever. Forty points from Lanier and a ten point victory started the basketball fever again. Next on the list was Detroit University. Spencer Heywood was not the only problem that had to be contended with. The Detroit sophomores carried the game and gave the win to Heywood. Loss number one brought the realization that there might be more.

This was confirmed all too quickly. Following a 109-76





win over Illinois Wesleyan, the Brown and White moved into Oklahoma City for the annual All-College Tournament. The University of the Pacific was disposed of 91-65 in the first round. But another Eastern power was also included in the field and the Iron Dukes of Duquesne impressed that fact on the Bonnies, rolling over them 89-70 in round two. It was the same story in the consolation round when host Oklahoma City beat St. Bonaventure 81-71.

With two losses in a row the Brown Indians returned home to face the top team in the East at the time—the Villanova Wildcats. The longest two seconds of the season saw Frank Gillen throw in a desperation jumper that stole the win for Villanova 68-67. It was a crushing loss for the Bonnies as they failed to recover in time and dropped their next one 70-59 three nights later at Providence.

It was now that the team needed a lift. The sophomores would have to come through. The Indians were faltering with a 6 and 5 record. Dale Tepas was inserted on the starting lineup, Lanier gained more speed, and the team was lifted. St. Francis of N.Y. and Niagara were beaten, but Duquesne was waiting again in Pittsburgh. The 15 point loss margin was not indicative of how close the Bonnies came to beating a Duquesne team that rarely loses in Pittsburgh.

The loss to Duquesne had not destroyed a momentum which was now growing. The Brown and White returned


home to belt Canisius 79-61 as Lanier scored 33. There was never any question of the outcome. This win would be the first of five in a row. Xavier fell 71-69 in the wake of one of the best single-game comebacks of the year. Fairfield was beaten with ease 105-80, with a fine team effort as the Indians awaited a battle with Marquette in New York City.

Leading the team as he had done all year, Bob Lanier poured in 36 points and Ed Klimkowski added 17 as the Bonnies ran away from Marquette 84-62. Another easy win followed against Kent State 81-58, but in a hotly contested affair in Chicago, DePaul outscored the Indians 72-71 in overtime. Again the team returned home to face an always dangerous Niagara ball club. Lanier proved to be too much for the Eagles as St. Bonaventure won 98-90. Two nights later All-American Lanier erased Tom Stith's old single-game scoring record as he tallied 51 points in helping beat Seton Hall 97-79 in the final home game of the season.

In rapping Canisius 91-64 at the Buffalo Auditorium, the Bonnies won their fourth straight Little Three Championship in as many years. Satalin and Lanier were outstanding.

In the season finale at Omaha, Nebraska, Billy Kalbaugh's layup with only seconds remaining beat Creighton 74-72. With Lanier out for most of the game, Captain Jim Satalin, playing his finest game of the season, led the determined Bonnies to a tremendous finish.
