







Carol has an amazing talent for quilting, shopping, being a wonderful mom and a great friend. Thank you for everything that you do, Carol. You're a role model for each of us.





















## Taking leaps outside of the Bona Bubble and into the great outdoors





# Sr. Margaret Carney, O.S.F. named as the 20th president of St. Bonaventure University

Feb. 23, 2004

Sr. Margaret Carney, O.S.F., who stepped in during the basketball eligibility crisis of spring 2003 to serve St. Bonaventure University as senior vice president for the Franciscan charism, has been named president-elect of the nearly 150-year-old Franciscan University.

We are overjoyed to announce the appointment of Sr. Margaret Carney as the next

president of St. Bonaventure University," said Susan Romanski Green, chair of the University's Board of Trustees. "She has played a pivotal role, along with Fr. Dominic Monti, in guiding the University during difficult times, and she has shared an exciting vision that we believe will lead the University to new heights, while maintaining its essential Franciscan character."

Green added special thanks to Fr. Dominic for his leadership during the past year: "He accepted a trying task at the most difficult of times, returning a Franciscan presence to University leadership when it was most needed," she said. "St. Bonaventure is — and continues to be — enormously grateful for the skill, knowledge, expertise and grace that Fr. Dominic has brought to the office during this trying time."

She noted that Fr. Dominic will continue to serve as president through May 31, 2004.

Sr. Margaret, who will be the institution's 20th president, was among three candidates chosen to meet with campus constituencies during visits last week. The search process began approximately one year ago with an initial pool of 60 candidates. The trustees held a special meeting in Newark over the weekend to interview the finalists and receive input submitted by campus constituencies, whereupon they elected Sr. Margaret.

Since her appointment as senior vice president for the Franciscan charism on March 9, 2003, Sr. Margaret has won



Sr. Margaret was the first and remains the sole woman to have earned a doctoral degree from Franciscan University in Rome, joining her bachelor's and master's degrees from Duquesne University and master's degree from the Franciscan Institute. She has served on the board of directors of the Franciscan University of Steubenville (Ohio), which awarded her an honorary doctorate, as has Madonna University of Livonia, Mich.

Sr. Margaret has been honored with an award acknowledging her perseverance and contributions to the writing of a new Rule for the Third Order Regular. The award was presented in August 2002 at the national meeting of the Franciscan Federation in St. Louis, Mo., to commemorate the 20th anniversary of the Rule's approval. She served as a member of the International Work Group of the Third Order Regular, which collaborated in drafting the new Rule, approved by Pope John Paul II in 1982.

An internationally known speaker on Franciscan life, she has presented numerous lectures at national and international conferences and makes regular appearances on Pittsburgh-area television as a guest of Bishop Donald Wuerl.

The president-elect will also be the first woman to serve in that capacity on a permanent basis; Sr. Alice Gallin, O.S.U., former University trustee, served as interim president in 1993-94.



### A Closer Look at Fr. Joe Doino, O.F.M.

A native of Dunkirk, N.Y., Fr. Joseph D. Doino, O.F.M., was ordained a Franciscan priest on January 2, 1950. Fr. Joe served as the Director of Franciscan novices before starting his teaching career at St. Bonaventure in 1986.

In May 1994, Fr. Joe became the first faculty member to receive the Faculty Appreciation Award posthumously. Fr. Joe died on March 7, 1994 at the age of 70. Fr. Jack Zibert, O.F.M., then guardian of the Friary, accepted the award on Fr. Joe's behalf.

Fr. Joe was known for his talent as a teacher, scholar, musician, preacher and priest. He was the adviser to Student Government and served on the Student Government Awards Committee since its inception.

The Honors and Awards Ceremony was renamed after Fr. Joe in 1995, honoring his commitment to the University community.




## College Colors
